MCC Noncredit Courses for Youth

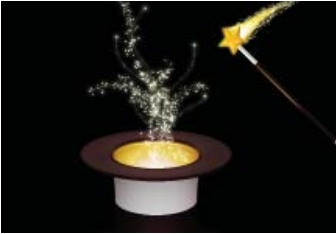


The Young Maiden's Literary Society

The cost is \$35.

This course is for mothers and daughters ages eight and older to participate in an in-depth study of the classical story "A Peep Behind the Scenes" by O.F. Walton. Participants read about four chapters per week at home from this bestselling book, which includes a Bible verse and a religious lesson in each chapter. Participants meet to discuss the reading and complete projects to learn vocabulary words and lessons about the culture depicted in the book. Participants are encouraged to dress in old-fashioned attire.

Off-Road Vehicle Safety

Taught by Vicki Goss. The cost is \$5.

Learn Michigan off-road vehicle (ORV/ATV) regulations. Participants receive valuable materials, complete registration forms and have an opportunity to complete an exam to earn a certificate, which is required for those ages 10 to 15. Registration is required two weeks before class starts so supplies can be ordered.

Open Water Scuba

Taught by Allen Baldwin. The cost is \$355.

During pool classes you'll get comfortable in scuba gear (provided by the instructor) and learn 32 skills you'll perform during two days of open-water diving. You must receive a 70 percent or better on the chapter quizzes and exams to receive a Professional Association of Diving Instruction (PADI) certification card for open-water diving, which is recognized worldwide. Students must be at least 10 years old.

Family Survival Swim

The cost is \$9.

Families experience a swamped canoe and learn how to survival float, survival swimming skills, how to care for someone with a neck or back injury and much more. All skills are performed in the shallow end of the pool for any non-swimming patrons. Families may stay for the open swim that immediately follows class to practice skills learned and to enjoy family swim time together.

Parent & Child Aquatics

The cost is \$25.

This American Red Cross program helps children ages 6 months to 5 years achieve a comfort level in and around the water and a readiness to swim. A parent must accompany each child in the pool.
