### **Next Round of Construction**

About a year ago we were able to move into the new connector that was built as the first phase of the construction project. As we approach spring the preparations have started for phase two of the construction project. This portion of the construction project is much larger and has impacts on all buildings.

This construction project is happening due to the support of the community when they passed the bond in the May 2018 election. The project was separated into two phases to maximize tax payer dollars by reducing capitalized interest that would have been incurred if bonds were sold at one time. The first phase was the construction of the "connector" that brought together both buildings and also included Central Office administration, elementary classrooms and a fitness center.

Construction for phase two will begin during spring break (end of March) and will last for 18 months due to the amount of work that needs to be completed. Listed below are the projects and the approximate completion time frames.

**Approximate completion date of August 2021:** renovated Elementary office\*, 2 renovated elementary classrooms\*, new playground, technology upgrades to jr/sr high, new jr/sr classroom furniture, band storage room addition, new parking and driveway behind buildings, and new bus canopy.

**Approximate completion date of March 2022**: renovations to 10 elementary classrooms\* and gross motor room.

**Approximate completion date of August 2022**: new elementary gym, renovated media center, 4 renovated elementary classrooms\*, new lower elementary playground, new monument sign.

\*Technology upgrades and new furniture are included with each classroom or office renovation. Mechanical upgrades and roof upgrades will take place as new spaces are completed.

There is a lot to look forward to with this exciting face lift for our district. There certainly will be challenges over the next year as we try to balance construction efforts and instruction simultaneously. Once everything is done the final product will be worth the challenges. What a great time to be a Mustang!





#### Edmore "Band of Brothers" become Eagle Scouts submitted by Mr. Danial Caulkett

Since 1931, when the Edmore Troop 78 presented its first Eagle Scout, there have only been thirteen young men to join the lofty list. That was until 2021 when five Edmore Boy Scouts from Troop 78 joined the small list. Scoutmaster, Dan Caulkett calls these five a "Band of Brothers". Ethan Smyth, Landon Erickson, Seth Davidson, Jakob Perkins, and Corey Rohn have stayed together, completed the requirements, proved to beat the odds, and reach the highest achievement in Scouting. Considering that only four out of every 100 youth that joins Scouting becomes an Eagle Scout, the fact that these five come from a troop that only had eight boys in 2020 makes it even more amazing.

Together they have earned more than 110 merit badges; completed nearly 400 hours of community service, and each completed a special Eagle Scout service project. The five have a friendship that goes back to early elementary school. All five are currently Juniors at Montabella High school.

The five Scouts have attended a week-long Scout Camp at the Cole Canoe Base in 2017, 2018, and 2019. All five completed youth leadership training at the Hiawatha Sportsman club in Naubinway, Michigan. Each earned the required merit badges that include Citizenship in the Community, Nation, and World, Environmental Science, Cooking, Camping, Hiking, First Aid, Communications, Personal Fitness, Personal Management, and Family Life. All five also earned additional merit badges in fingerprinting, Indian Lore, Leatherworks, Backpacking, and more.
