Solar Energy Coming to Montabella

The Montabella Community Schools Board of Education has been investigating the idea of a solar energy field for the past several months. This field of panels would be located on the south end of the school property by the football and baseball fields. The panels would generate solar energy that then can be used to help power the electrical needs of the school buildings. The board of education plans to review the service agreement with Sun FundEd at the May 18 regular board of education meeting.

Renewable energy is something that has become more popular over the past few years with many residents and businesses looking at wind and solar as potential options. The school district is a big consumer of electricity and by offsetting some of that electrical use with solar energy it frees up space for other needs in the community. Educationally opportunities also arise from a solar project as students can see first hand the energy produced and saved.

Solar projects for schools work a little differently than residential projects. The size of the solar field that would be needed to produce enough energy to truly offset the school's energy use would not be financially feasible on our own. This is where a third party comes in to help. The third party, in our case, Sun FundEd finds investors that will purchase the equipment needed and the installation of the solar field. The school pays NO costs for the purchase and installation. The district agrees to terms with Sun FundEd for a service fee that is paid throughout the length of the agreement. The service fee is offset by the savings the district will see in electrical costs which nets an overall savings to the district and the opportunity to be environmentally conscious consumers. Initial estimates show a long term savings of over \$1 million through the 30 year contract.

Interested in hearing more about the project or have questions that you would like answered? Come to the May 18 board of education meeting at 7pm. Meetings take place at the jr/sr high cafeteria. If in person meetings are not allowed at that time the meeting will be held through video conferencing in which the public can attend through video or phone connection.
