# **New Partnership**

Montabella Community Schools has entered into a partnership with Home Township to provide a School Resource Officer at Montabella Community Schools starting in the 2022-2023 school year. Home Township will be hiring a new police officer that will spend the school days positioned at the school and then during the summer months and school breaks that officer will be an additional patrol officer that will cover Home Township. This partnership allows for both the school and the township to add services that will benefit the community.

A School Resource Officer has some specific duties that they will perform when they are at the school. Some of those duties include: school safety plans, security of the campus, classroom presentations, and truancy support. The School Resource Officer will not be responsible for doing school discipline and violations of school rules will still be handled by the building principals. There are some violations of school rules that result in police reports (assault, illegal drugs, etc.) that the School Resource Officer will be able to handle the law enforcement side of the investigation and reporting. The same officer will be in the schools on a daily basis which also allows for them to build some relationships with students and families in the community.

One of the goals of our district is to provide a safe learning environment for all students. Many school districts, including Montabella, have noticed an increase in potential threats of violence at schools. This partnership will provide a presence of law enforcement which will hopefully deter such threats or events in the future. Thanks to Home Township for working with the school to help provide this additional service.




