When the clock struck midnight on January 1, 2020 I don't think anyone could have predicted where we would be 10 months later. The only consistent thing throughout this year has been the inconsistency. It has been difficult as a school district to prepare for all the unexpected turns that we have faced during these past 10 months. All things considered, we are off to a pretty good start to the school year.

88% of our students and their families made the choice to attend school in person this fall with different safety processes and procedures in place. This positive start was due to the collaborative

efforts from everyone in the school community. We have received a number of compliments from educators and the community of other school districts on our plan and the effectiveness of the plan. Parents, teachers, support staff, administrators and community members have displayed patience and understanding as we worked through new drop off procedures, meal distribution, virtual meetings and many other changes. All of us should be very proud of the combined efforts to allow our students to be back at school in person.

The district continues to look at current COVID-19 data, this is done publicly at each board meeting prior to the board reaffirming how instruction will be offered. The positive cases in our three counties are rising as they are in most counties in the state. The district remains in constant communication with the health department and other districts on the current situation in our county. At this time the health department feels confident that schools are safe to continue with in person instruction for our county. If 2020 has taught us anything it is that things could change quickly so we are trying to be as prepared as possible for the institution to move to remote learning only. Students are bringing Chromebooks and chargers back and forth from home to school on a regular basis, this will allow students technology access from home for remote learning.

I anticipate that the last 2 months of 2020 might be as unpredictable as the first 10 months. The rolling of the calendar over to 2021 will not end the unpredictability. This might be our reality for guite some time. We are all trying to be as prepared as possible but sometimes it still takes some time and patience to work through unpredictable changes. I hope that we can all continue to work together as a community. #MustangPride



I love to find clients who don't have a good video conferencing tool because they are always in "awe" once they see how powerful Zoom is.

## Changes at Montabella

Growing stronger, together

Montabella Athletics recently had two Pixellot cameras installed: one at the Football stadium and one in the Elementary Gym. These cameras are fully automated, programmed to follow the action of the game, with a clear resolution picture. By having these cameras, Montabella Community Schools becomes part of the NFHS Network. Any home game played on the football field and in the elementary gym will be broadcast live, and in most cases, available by video on demand. To view these live streamed events, you need to create an account at www.nfhsnetwork.com and then chose a subscription plan. There are two plans: monthly (\$10.99) or annually (\$69.99). During your subscription time, you can watch any game broadcast through the NFHS Network, and if other schools we play also have this ability, you can watch away games, as well. One other perk of having these cameras, is the ability to live stream academic events (at no charge)



that take place in these two locations. For example, Graduation takes place in the elementary

gym, we have the ability to live stream this event, as well as many others. This can be done at no charge. We are excited for this opportunity and ability to allow community members not able to make an event in person, the ability to watch it in real time.


GCOM (Great Commission Outreach Ministries of Six Lakes) recently donated money to help Montabella Elementary purchase our new Raptor Technologies Reunification System. This system is adding another element of security for our students and staff.

Anyone who is picking up a student will be asked to show a photo ID that we now scan and save in our database as an approved pick-up. If it is a one-time pickup, we will ask for a photo ID for each visit. Guardians that are approved to sign a student out will all be attached to the student(s). This system syncs with our PowerSchool, so when changes are made in PowerSchool it will automatically

update our Raptor system.

All visitors will be required to show a photo ID when they enter the building and will then be entered into our database ensuring another level of security within the building.


